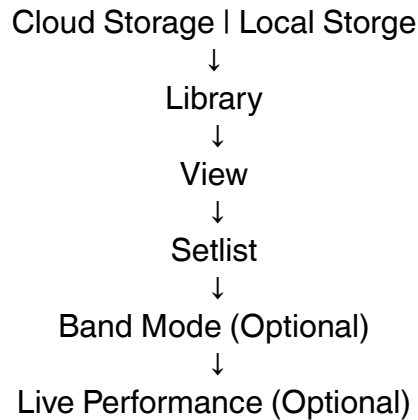

Workflow Overview



Get Started in Less Than 1 Minute

Welcome to Chordasy! Follow these simple steps to start managing and sharing your chord charts.

Step 1 – Cloud Storage / Local Storage

Open Settings → Cloud Services

Connect one of the supported cloud providers:

Dropbox, Google Drive or click on library and import Chart from local Storage

Once connected, select the folder containing your chord charts.

Step 2 – Open Chart

Tap Library from the navigation bar.

Chordasy will automatically load and display the charts stored in your selected cloud folder.

Supported formats: PDF, JPG, PNG

Step 3 – Create Setlist

Tap Setlist.

Click New Setlist

Enter a setlist name

Add songs from your library

Step 4 – Band Mode

Tap Band On.

Enter your display name

Tap Scan to discover other members

Connect to musicians on the same Wi-Fi network

Step 5 – Share Charts and Messaging

Select a connected member and tap Send.

Step 6 – Live Performance Mode

Tap Live.

Use the built-in tools: BPM Display, Click Track, Tempo Visualizer, Annotation Tools

Chapter 1

Getting Started

① Navigation Bar

The Navigation Bar provides quick access to the main areas of Chordasy.

Use these buttons to switch between:

- Library – Browse and manage your chord charts.
- Setlist – Create and organize song lists for rehearsals and live performances.
- Settings – Configure Chordasy preferences and cloud services.
- Band On – Connect and collaborate with other Chordasy members.
- Live – Enter performance mode for distraction-free viewing.

② Quick Action Toolbar

The Quick Action Toolbar gives you instant access to commonly used chart functions.

Available actions include:

- Transpose – Change the key of the current chord chart.
- Reset – Restore the original key.
- BPM – Set or view the song tempo.
- Tools – Access additional chart utilities.
- Add To Setlist – Add the current song directly to a setlist.

These tools are designed to help musicians make quick adjustments during rehearsals and live performances.

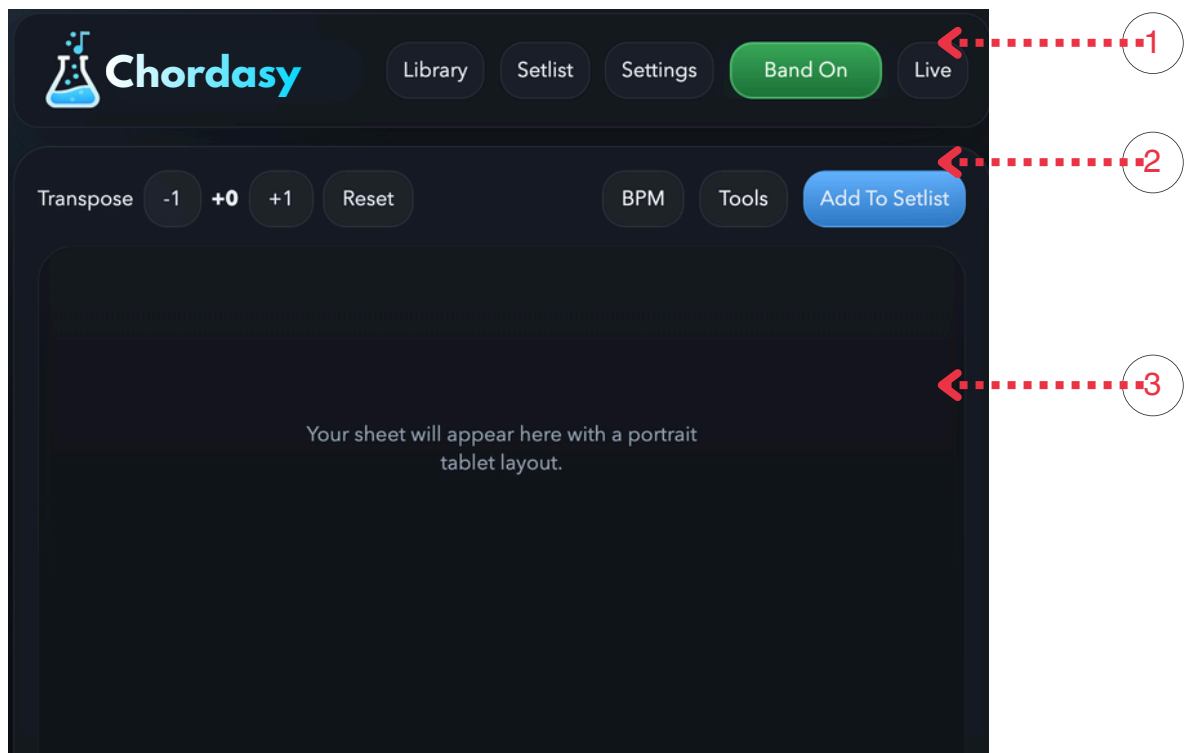
③ Chart Display Area

The Chart Display Area is where your chord charts and song sheets are displayed.

Once a chart is opened, this area provides:

- Clear and readable chart viewing
- Smooth scrolling and navigation
- Real-time updates from team members
- Optimized layout for tablets and live performance use

This is the primary workspace where musicians interact with their charts during practice, rehearsals, and services.



Chapter 1

Getting Started

BPM & Tempo Tools

Chordasy includes a built-in BPM tool designed to help musicians maintain a consistent tempo during rehearsals and live performances.

The BPM toolbar can be opened directly from Live Mode and remains accessible while viewing chord charts.

BPM Display

The current BPM (Beats Per Minute) is displayed in real time.

Adjust the BPM slider to match the tempo of the song being performed.

Enhance Mode

The Enhance button activates a visual BPM indicator around the chart display area.

This provides an easy-to-follow visual tempo reference, especially useful for worship leaders, drummers, and musicians playing without a click track.

Click Track

The Click button enables an audible metronome.

Musicians can use the click track to maintain a steady tempo during rehearsals and performances.

Start / Stop

Use Start to begin the BPM visualizer and click track.


Use Stop to pause playback at any time.

Close BPM Toolbar

Tap the close button to hide the BPM toolbar and return to normal chart viewing.

Performance Tip

For songs with complex arrangements or tempo-sensitive transitions, use the BPM visualizer and click track to help the entire band stay synchronized throughout the performance.

Annotation Tools

The Annotation Toolbar allows musicians to mark up chord charts directly within Live Mode. Use these tools to highlight important sections, make performance notes, and personalize charts for rehearsals and live performances.

Pen Tool

Draw freely on the chart using your finger, stylus, or mouse. Perfect for adding reminders, markings, or performance notes.

Highlighter Tool

Highlight important lyrics, chords, song sections, or transitions. This helps musicians quickly identify key parts of a song during a performance.

Color Selection

Choose from multiple annotation colors to organize different types of notes and markings. Different colors can be used for chords, lyrics, cues, or band instructions.

Eraser Tool

Remove individual annotations without affecting the original chart. Useful for correcting mistakes or updating notes.

Clear Annotations

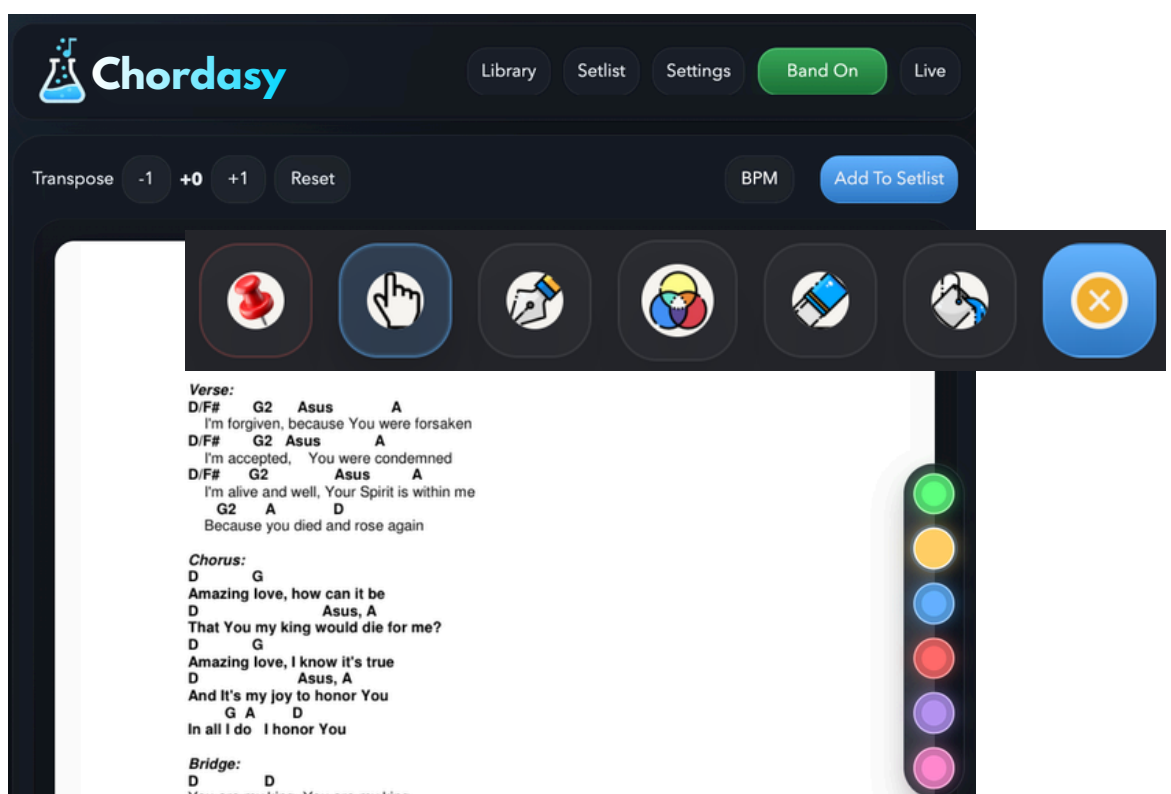
Remove all annotations from the current chart with a single tap. The original PDF chart remains unchanged.

Close Annotation Toolbar

Hide the Annotation Toolbar and return to normal chart viewing.

Performance Tip

Use annotations to mark song structures, key changes, repeat sections, solos, or worship cues before rehearsals and live performances. This allows musicians to follow arrangements more confidently without modifying the original chart.

Connecting to Cloud Services

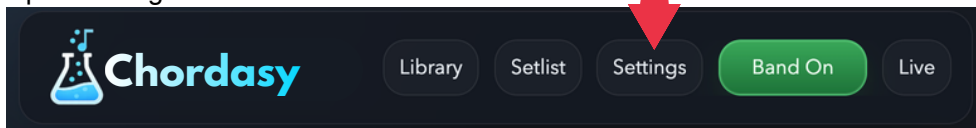
Chordasy supports cloud storage integration, allowing you to access, synchronize, and share your chord charts across multiple devices.

Benefits of Cloud Services

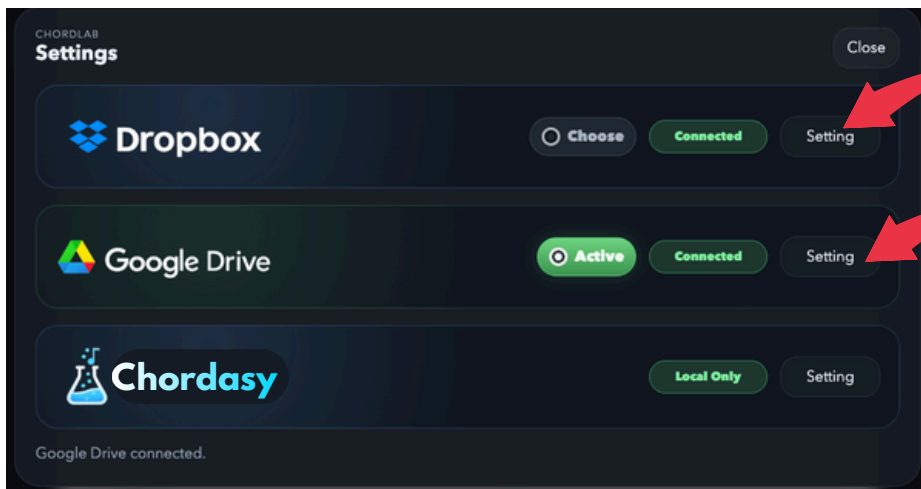

Steps:

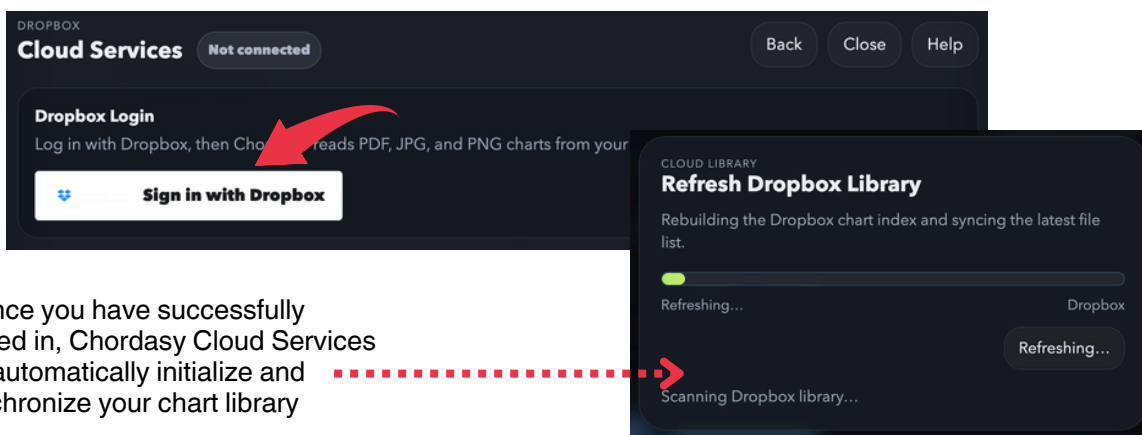
1. Open Settings



2. Select Cloud Services



3. Sign in to your cloud provider and tap "Allow" when prompted.



4. Once you have successfully signed in, Chordasy Cloud Services will automatically initialize and synchronize your chart library

Band Mode

Band Mode

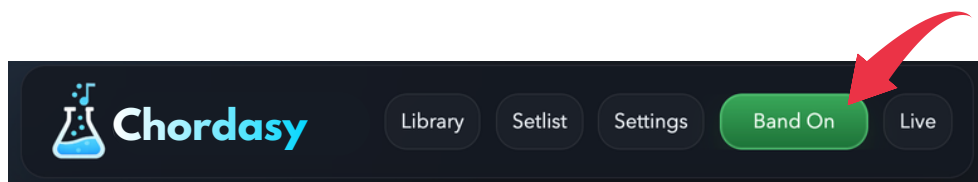
Band Mode allows musicians to connect, communicate, and share chord charts with other Chordasy users on the same network.

Whether you're rehearsing, leading worship, or performing live, Band Mode helps keep your entire team synchronized and connected.

Tip 💡

For the best Band Mode experience, ensure all devices are connected to the same Wi-Fi network before scanning for members.

Once connected, musicians can instantly share chord charts, synchronize setlists, and collaborate in real time. 🎵👏📱



① Band Mode Switch

Enable or disable Band Mode.

When Band Mode is turned on:

Your device becomes discoverable by other Chordasy users.

You can send and receive chord charts.

Team messaging and chart synchronization become available.

Other musicians can identify and connect to your device.

② Your Name

Set your display name.

This is the name other musicians will see when:

Discovering your device

Receiving charts from you

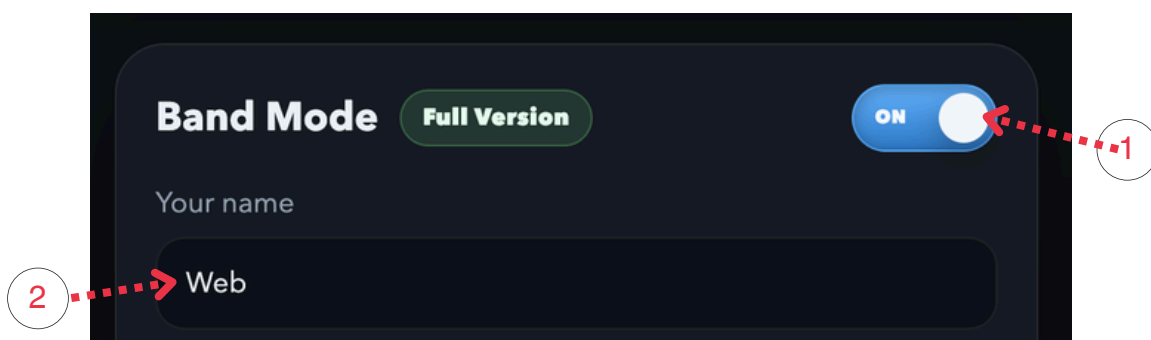
Viewing member lists

Exchanging messages

Examples

- *Keyboard*
- *Guitar*
- *Bass*

Choose a name that clearly identifies your role within the team.

Band Mode

③ Member Online

View all connected Chordasy members.

The Member Online section displays:

Connected musicians

Device names

Online status

Available members for chart sharing

This helps you quickly identify who is currently available within your band.

④ Scan

Discover nearby Chordasy members.

Tap Scan to search for other Chordasy users on the same local network.

Chordasy will automatically detect available members and add them to the online member list.

⑤ Add Member

Connect manually using an IP address.

If automatic discovery is unavailable, you can manually add another member by entering their IP address and connection details.

- Complex network environments
- Different network segments
- Troubleshooting connection issues

⑥ Remove Member

Remove a connected member from the list.

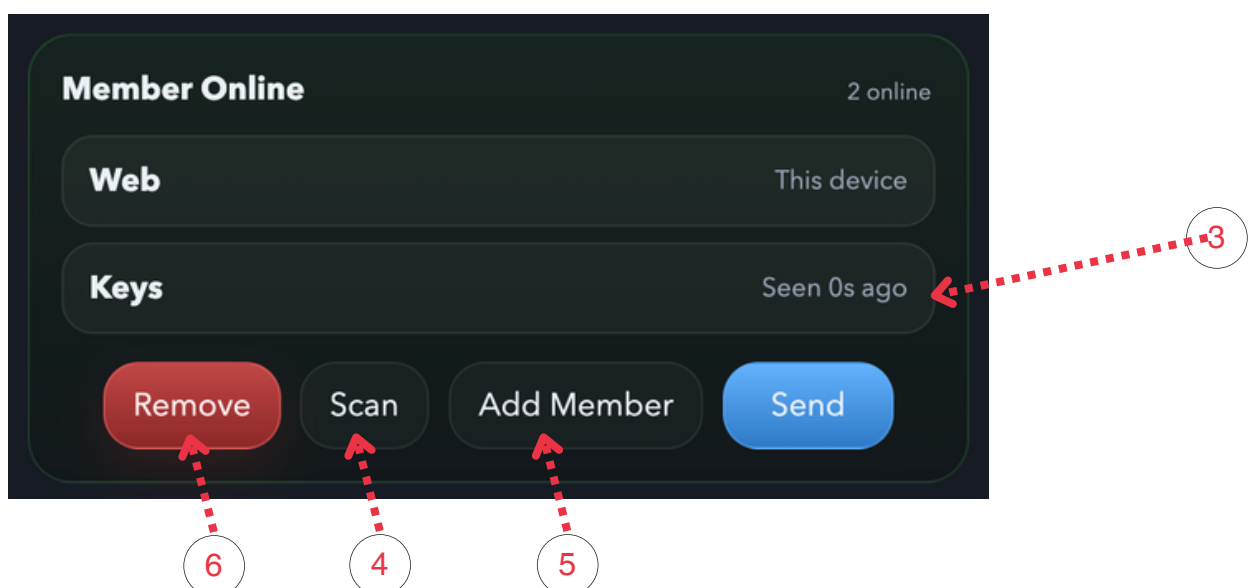
Use this option when:

A member leaves the session

A device is no longer available

You want to clean up inactive connections

Removing a member does not delete any charts or data.



Chapter 3

Band Mode

⑦ Connection Status

At the bottom of the screen, Chordasy displays the current Band Mode status, including your display name and network address.

Example:

Band Mode is on as Keyboard · IP 192.168.1.238:8040

This information can be useful when manually connecting devices or troubleshooting network connections.

⑧ Send Charts

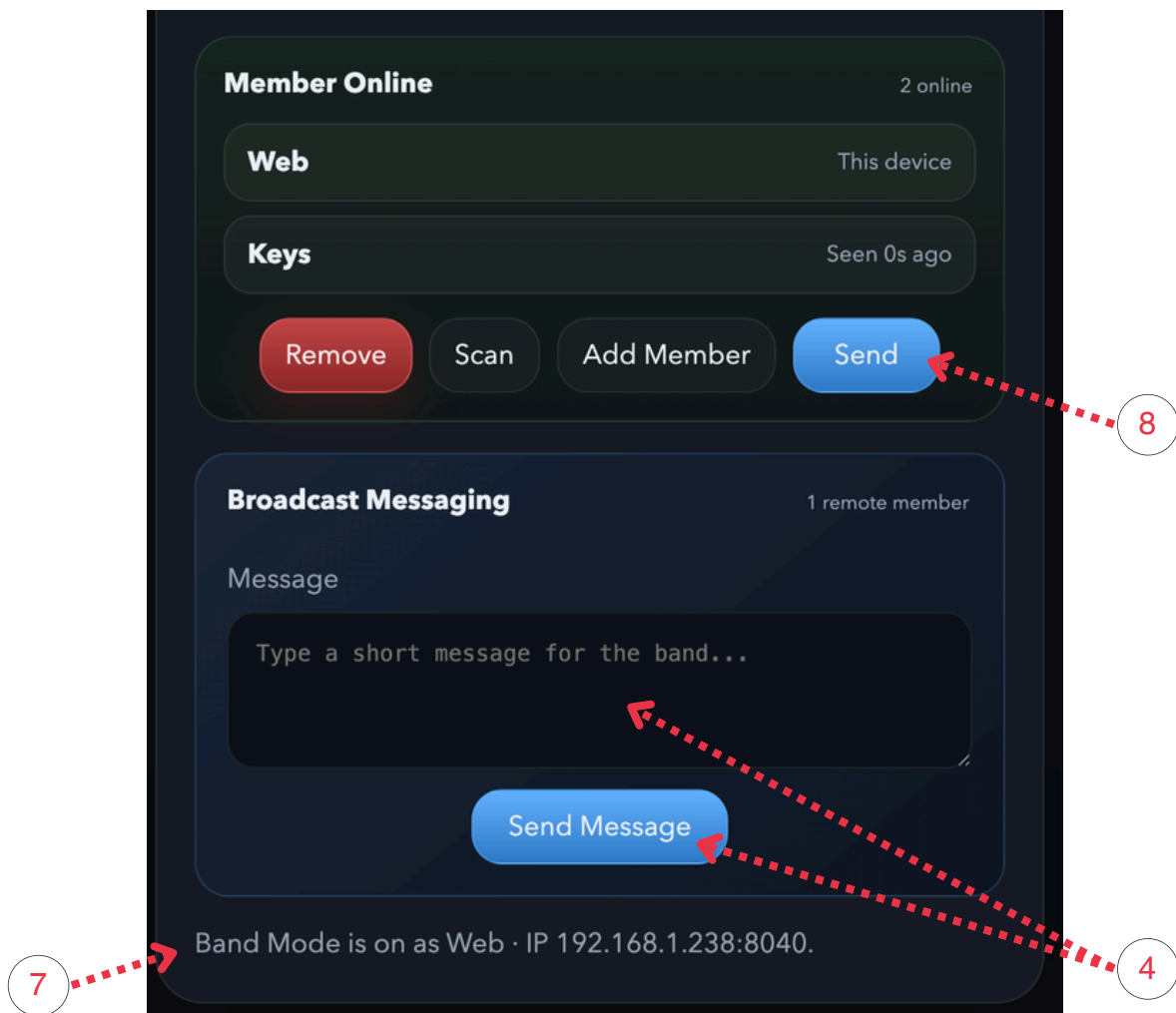
The Send button allows you to instantly share the currently selected chord chart with a connected Chordasy member.

This helps keep all musicians synchronized during rehearsals and live performances.

⑨ Broadcast Messaging

Broadcast Messaging allows you to send a text message to all connected members at once.

Use it to quickly communicate song changes, rehearsal notes, or performance instructions without leaving Chordasy.



Chapter 3

Band Mode

⑩ Notifications & Status Indicators

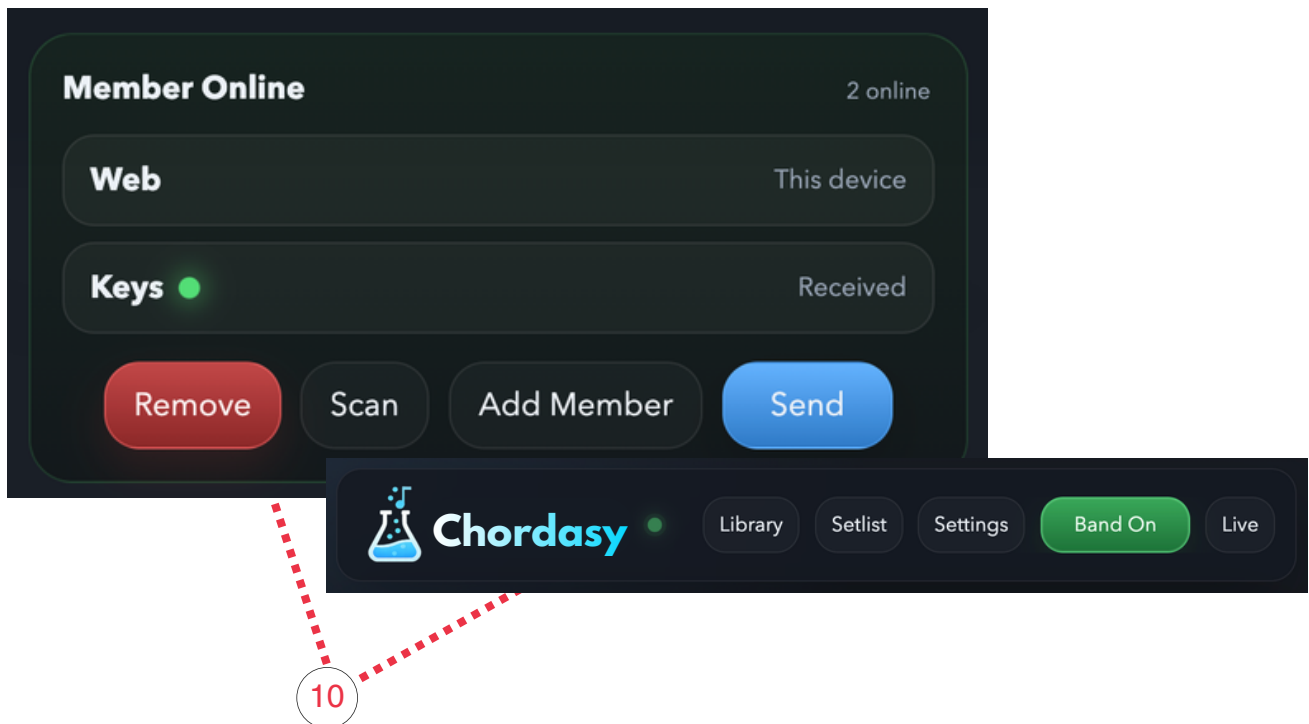
When a chart or message is sent or received, Chordasy will display status indicators and notifications next to the Chordasy logo and within the Member Online list.

These indicators provide real-time feedback on communication and synchronization activities between connected members.

Examples include:

- Chart Sent
- Chart Received
- Message Received
- Member Connected
- Member Disconnected

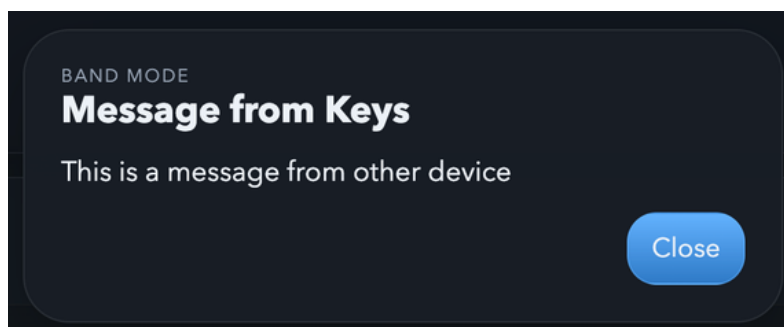
This allows musicians to quickly confirm that charts and messages have been successfully delivered during rehearsals and live performances.



⑪ Broadcast Message Notifications

When a broadcast message is received, Chordasy will display a popup notification to alert the user.

This helps ensure important messages are noticed during rehearsals and live performances.



Chapter 4

Chordasy Settings

① PDF First Page Only

When enabled, Chordasy will display only the first page of each chart.

This allows page navigation to move directly to the next song in the setlist, making live performances smoother and reducing unnecessary scrolling.

② Band Mode – Chart Auto-Open

When enabled, received chord charts will automatically open as soon as they are received.

When disabled, Chordasy will display a confirmation notification before opening the chart.

This is useful for musicians who prefer to review incoming charts manually.

③ Visual BPM Color

Customize the visual BPM indicator color used in Live Mode.

The selected color will be displayed when BPM information is shown, helping musicians quickly identify tempo cues during rehearsals and performances.

Choose a color that best matches your preference or stage environment.


④ Transpose Font Size

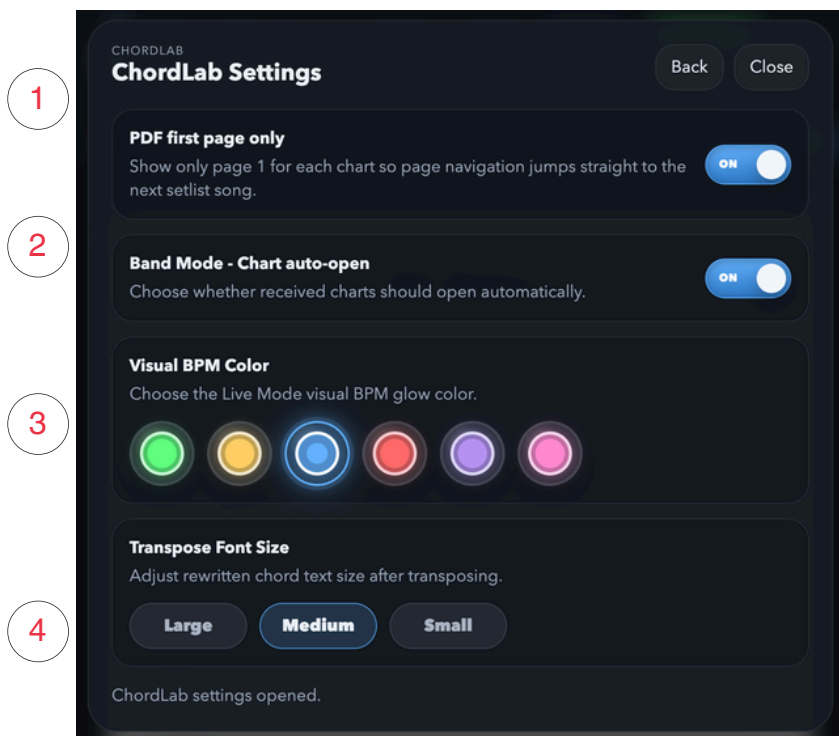
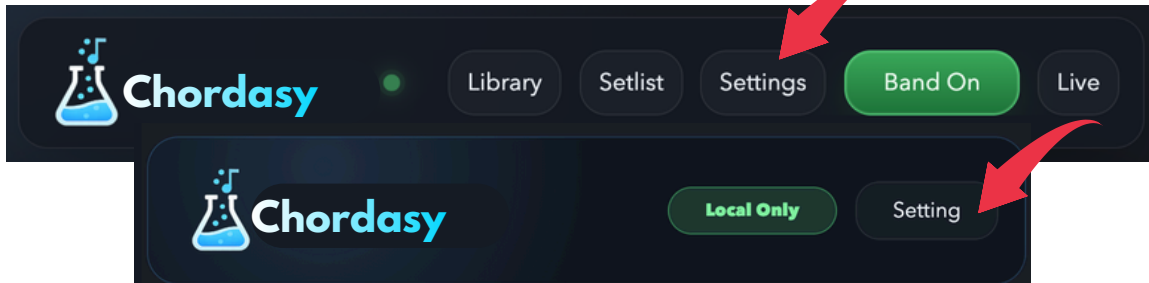
Adjust the font size used when displaying transposed chord charts.

Available options include:

- Large – Easier to read from a distance.
- Medium – Recommended for most users.
- Small – Displays more content on screen.

Select the size that provides the best balance between readability and chart visibility.

 **Tip: Settings are saved automatically and will be applied the next time Chordasy is launched.**



Chapter 5

Setlist Management

Setlist Management

The Setlist Manager allows you to organize songs into structured setlists for rehearsals, worship services, and live performances.

Using setlists helps musicians quickly navigate between songs and ensures the entire team follows the same performance order.

① Current Set

The Current Set panel displays the active setlist currently selected in Chordasy.

All songs within the selected setlist will be available for quick access during rehearsals and live performances.

② New Setlist

Click New Setlist to create a new setlist.

Setlists can be created for different events, such as:

Sunday Worship

Youth Service

Band Rehearsal

Special Events

Concert Performances

③ Selected Setlist

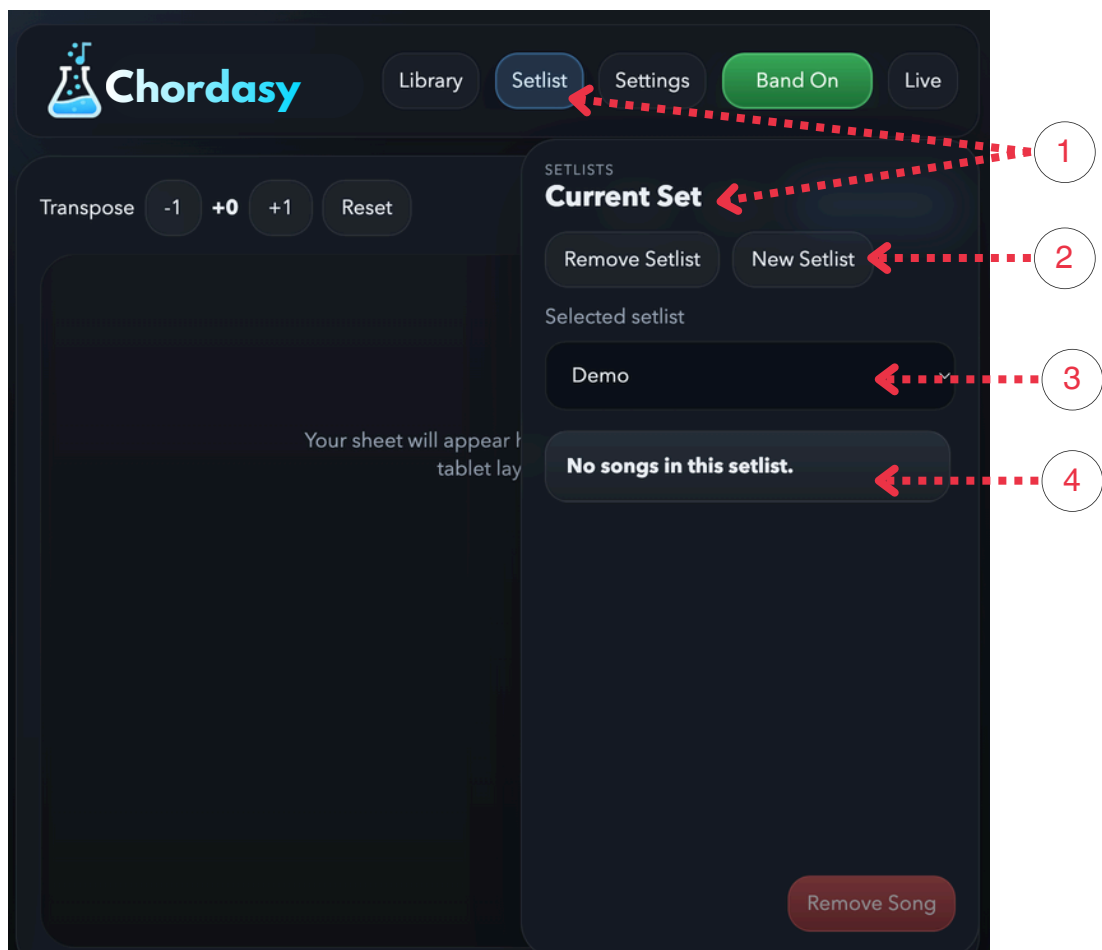
Use the dropdown menu to select and switch between existing setlists.

Once selected, all songs belonging to that setlist will be displayed in the song list area.

④ Song List

The Song List displays all songs currently assigned to the selected setlist.

Selecting a song will immediately load the corresponding chord chart into the chart viewer.

Setlist Management

⑤ Remove Setlist

The Remove Setlist button permanently removes the selected setlist.

Only the setlist is removed. The original chord charts stored in your library will remain unchanged.

⑥ Remove Song

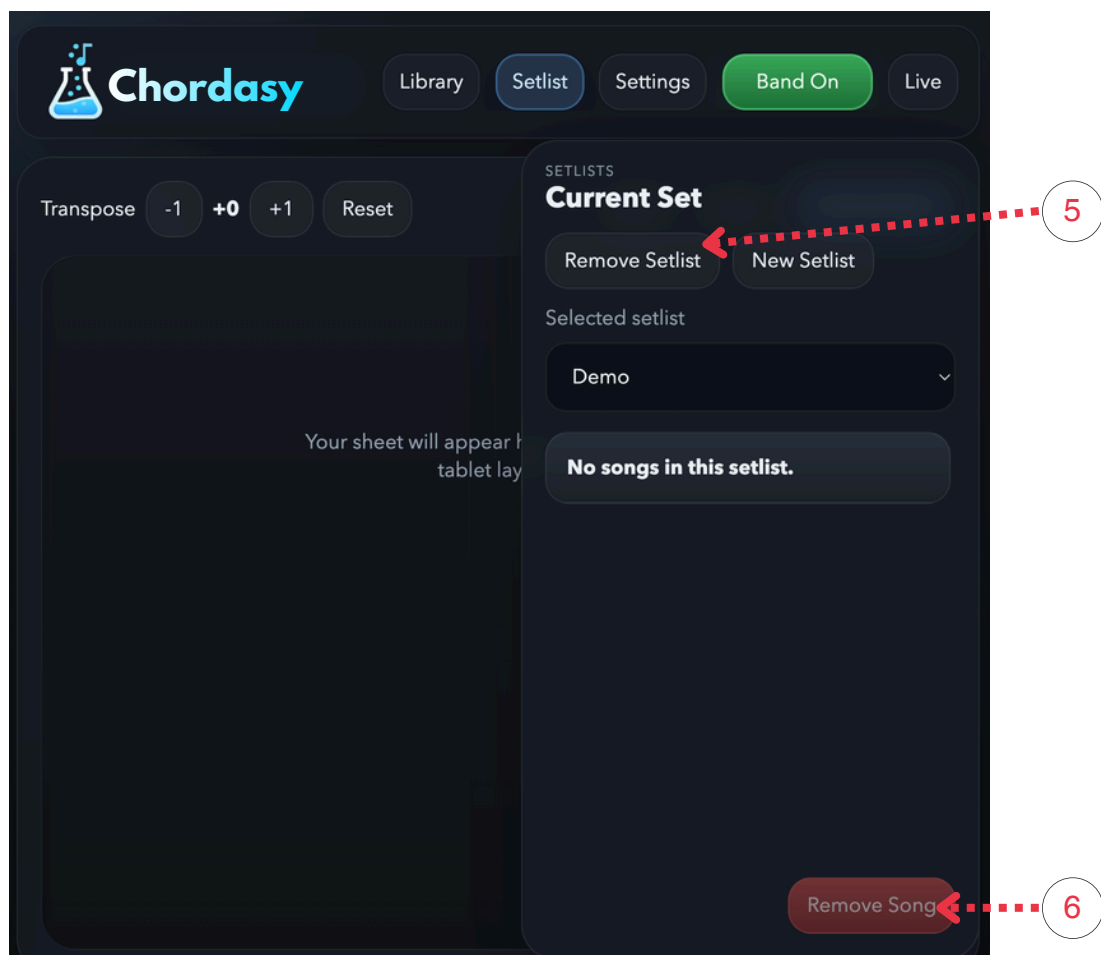
The Remove Song button removes the selected song from the current setlist.

The chart itself remains in your library and can be added back to any setlist at any time.

🎵 Tip

Create separate setlists for different services, events, or rehearsals to keep your music organized and easily accessible.

A well-organized setlist helps musicians transition smoothly between songs and stay focused during live performances.



Chapter 6

Live Performance Mode

Live Mode

Live Mode is designed specifically for rehearsals, worship services, and live performances.


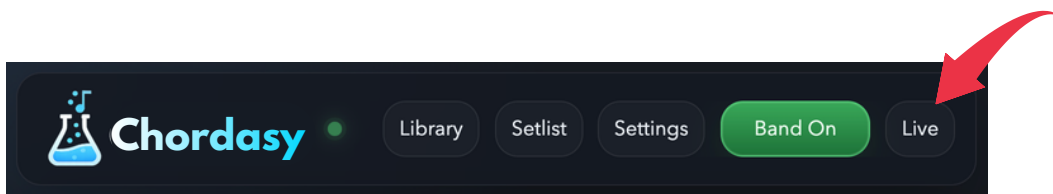
To enter Live Mode, simply tap the Live button from the main navigation bar. Once activated, Chordasy switches to a distraction-free viewing experience, allowing musicians to focus entirely on the performance.

BPM Display

Tap the BPM button to view tempo information and visual BPM indicators. This helps musicians maintain a consistent tempo throughout the song.

Tools

The Tools menu provides quick access to additional chart and performance functions without leaving Live Mode.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why can't I find another member?

Ensure Band Mode is enabled

Ensure both devices are on the same Wi-Fi network

Try using Add Member manually

Q: Why is my chart not opening?

Verify the chart format is PDF, JPG, or PNG

Confirm the cloud folder has been selected

Q: Why is cloud synchronization not working?

Verify your cloud account is connected
